Traditional Moral Values

- 1) Do you believe that marriage is between one man and one woman?

- 2) Do you believe that the U.S. Supreme Court's decisions in *Obergefell v. Hodges* and *United States v. Windsor* means that same-sex marriage is now "settled law" or do you recognize that no governmental body possesses the rightful authority to enable those engaging in sexually abominable behaviors and lifestyles?

- 3) Do you support or oppose the Rainbow Jihad's latest mutations, including but not limited to "transgenderism," Drag Queen Story Hour, state tax-dollars underwriting the "Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender" Youth Commission, the decriminalization of pedophilia, the reparative therapy ban, promotion of homosexual-oriented literature in public libraries and the misleadingly named "Healthy Youth Act" (which mandates the graphically obscene sex-ed curriculum?

- 4) Would you be able to resist the peer pressure to vote for a pro-LGBT politician in your party's primary, caucus or other contested party election, if they were running against a pro-family candidate?

- 5) There have been homosexual Republicans in Massachusetts who have either ran for or have held high-profile public offices. How would you address this in the light of the fact that the RNC and MassGOP platforms stand for traditional moral values; yet, there have been high-profile Republican candidates who regularly engage in sexually abominable behaviors (Leviticus 18:22) that countermand Biblical law as well as our party's platform?

- 6) Would you support "Justina's Bill," which would protect parents given two differing medical courses of treatment for their child, and affirm their rights to choose the most appropriate care without the threat of the state overruling them?

7) Would you support repealing the 209A/258E laws (that allow women to claim spousal endangerment without evidence), as these misleadingly named laws not only violate the due process rights of the accused, but also creates broken families and makes criminals out of men who have not violated anyone's natural rights?

8) Are you willing to include on your campaign platform (including but not limited to your website, social media pages, campaign push cards etc.) where you stand on marriage and other traditional moral and family values issues?

9) Do you believe that the Republican Party (nationally, statewide and locally) should continue to tolerate the presence of the Log Cabin Republicans, a national homosexual advocacy group with statewide and local affiliates that also acts as a fifth column to push homosexual issues in the Republican Party?

Immigration Enforcement

- 1) Do you support or oppose amnesty (whether through a blanket amnesty or an "earned legalization" or any other form) for illegal aliens?
- 2) Where do you stand on the DACA Program, an illegal, unconstitutional program that rewards illegal aliens by allowing them to stay in the country illegally and undermines immigration enforcement?
- 3) Do you support or oppose providing taxpayer-funded benefits for illegal aliens? Examples include but not limited to driver's licenses, free K-12 education, federal aid to sanctuary jurisdiction, subsidized tuition at public universities and colleges and other welfare benefits.
- 4) Do you support or oppose the efforts of the lesser magistrates (state, county and local government officials) to hinder the enforcement of our federal immigration laws by declaring themselves as "sanctuary jurisdictions"?

- 5) The United States admits over 1 million immigrants to this country each year through the legal immigration process. Should this number be increased, decreased, or maintained and how did you arrive at your conclusion?
- 6) Do you support mandating the use of the federal e-Verify system to screen out illegal foreign job applicants and to identify and fire existing employees who used fraudulent and stolen identities to obtain jobs?
- 7) Should Congress move the United States in line with most other countries and stop the policy of bestowing automatic citizenship at birth to children born on American soil when both parents are illegal aliens, tourists or other visitors?
- 8) Should Congress require federal immigration authorities to cooperate with local law enforcement, including picking up all illegal aliens detained locally and training law enforcement in 287(g) and other applicable programs designed to enable local governments to assist federal immigration enforcement?

- 9) Should Congress implement the 1996 bipartisan Jordan Commission recommendation to limit family-based immigration to the immigrant's nuclear family (spouse and minor children), thus eliminating the "chain migration" categories of extended family that resulted in annual immigration levels increasing fourfold since the 1950s?
- 10) Should Congress institute safeguards to prevent importation of foreign workers (particularly on permanent visas) if their presence would threaten the jobs or depress the wages of American workers?
- 11) Are you willing to include on your campaign platform (including but not limited to your website, social media pages, campaign pushcards etc.) where you stand on immigration and other national question issues?
- 12) Would you be able to resist the peer pressure to vote for a pro-open-borders politician in your party's primary, caucus or other contested party election, if they were running against a pro-immigration enforcement candidate?

Supporting Other Values-Oriented Candidates in Contested Party Elections and Empowering the Grassroots

- 1) Do you support restoring the local delegate caucuses to the Republican National Convention so that the people and not the party insiders can decide who represents them at the convention?
- 2) How would you handle a situation in which a trusted party official or political action committee operative was promoting policies and candidates that run counter to their stated conservative values and our party's platform?
- 3) Are there any specific changes you would make to the MassGOP and RNC platforms?
- 4) Do you support reforming the process for chartering Republican-oriented organizations (such as the MA Federation of Republican Women), and how would you propose reforming it?
- 5) How will you be able to ensure you serve the interests of all Republicans equally and independently?
- 6) How would you ensure that there is fairness and transparency in contested party elections, including but not limited to voting for party officials, local caucuses, and party conventions to enable that MassGOP to shed its "MessGOP" reputation?

Right to Life

- 1) What is your stance on abortion?
- 2) Do you agree that abortion is always wrong and must be prohibited, even when the baby's father is a criminal (that is, a rapist)?
- 3) Will you courageously help lead the continued legal and political efforts to acknowledge that the word "person" includes every human being from beginning of the biological development (i.e., the moment of conception) of that human being?
- 4) Will you oppose all taxpayer funding of abortion, including opposing funding for all chemical and surgical abortion regardless of the reproductive circumstances at the beginning of the child's life, and oppose all taxpayer funding for Planned Parenthood, the largest and richest conglomerate in the abortion industry?

- 5) Will you oppose euthanasia in all its various forms, including doctor-assisted suicide and starvation by denial of food and water?
- 6) While adult stem cell research is delivering real-world cures and boundless hope, intentionally killing a single child even to save the whole world is clearly wrong. Will you advocate for prohibition of, and oppose any funding or regulation or legislation for, practices that would intentionally destroy the tiniest living humans in embryonic stem cell research?
- 7) Legislation that says, "Abortion shall be prohibited except..." and which requires a woman to meet some condition like waiting 24 hours or giving her written consent before having her child killed, in effect re-affirms the approval of the State for such abortions, delays the abolition of abortion and dehumanizes preborn children. Will you refuse to support any legislation, even so-called "pro-life regulations" that, after certain conditions are met permit abortion?
- 8) Would you support legislation that ensures the protection of born and preborn persons by criminalizing all forms of abortion (including gruesome "surgical abortion" and ghastly self-induced abortion pills (such as Mifeprex and mifepristone)) and all parties to abortion the same way we criminalize the murder of born persons? Examples of such legislation include the Abolition of Abortion bills introduced in the Alaska, Idaho, Washington, Indiana, Oklahoma and Texas legislatures.

- 9) Would you be willing to sponsor or co-sponsor An Act to Abolish Abortion in Massachusetts – or an equivalent act by a different name modeled on abolitionist legislation in Alaska, Idaho, Washington, Indiana, Oklahoma and Texas – and will vote in favor of it.
- 10) Would you be willing to publicly and boldly support for An Act to Abolish Abortion in Massachusetts and the cause of abolition?
- 11) Would you be willing to do these things in support of abolishing abortion even if it means standing up to the Republican and pro-life establishments?
- 12) Do you agree with all of the five components of an abolition bill. (You can read the five components [here](#) if you have not already.)
- 13) Do you believe that bills that regulate and therefore allowing the murder of preborn human beings, are both unbiblical and unconstitutional, even if the Renew Massachusetts Coalition, Massachusetts Citizens for Life, Massachusetts Family Institute and their various allied groups promotes them as incrementalist pro-life legislation and common sense regulations on abortion.

- 14) Are you willing to include on your campaign platform (including but not limited to your website, social media pages, campaign push cards etc.) where you stand on abortion?
- 15) Do you recognize that no governmental body possesses the rightful authority to legalize the murder of born and preborn, whether through judicial diktat or through legislative and ballot question referendum tyrannies of the majority?
- 16) Would you be able to resist the peer pressure to vote for a pro-abortion politician in your party's primary, caucus or other contested party elections, if they were running against an anti-abortion candidate?
- 17) How would you have voted on the 2018 NASTY Women Act (the misleadingly named An Act Negating Archaic Statutes Targeting Young Women), which legislatively legalized abortion in Massachusetts by repealing Massachusetts's unenforced laws against abortion?

18) How would you vote on the 2019-2020 ROE Act bills (H3320 & S1209), which expands abortion up to and after birth as well as expands taxpayer funding of abortion?

19) Have you ever had the opportunity to share your views on these issues prior to this election (Please provide verifiable links)?

20) What was the catalyst that led you to adopt the positions you have on life issues?

Fiscal Issues

- 1) Do you support or oppose Proposition 2½ Overrides, Debt Exclusions, Capital Exclusions and the “Local-Option Meals Tax”?

- 2) Would you be willing to sign the Taxpayer Protection Pledge sponsored by Americans for Tax Reform?

- 3) How would you have voted on the 2018 Car Rental Excise Tax Increase or the Community Benefit Districts (aka, the Neighborhood Tax, a piece of legislation that would effectively undermine Prop 2.5)?

- 4) How would you have voted on the 2018 “Legislative Grand Bargain” which included a new .75% payroll tax (split between employer and employee) on Massachusetts wages and self-employed income?

- 5) In your opinion, what is the maximum level of taxation and spending any single level of government should collect and expend? What is the maximum level of taxation and spending that all levels of government taken together (federal, state, county, regional, municipal et al) should collect and expend?
- 6) Do you believe that any effort to increase the tax burden should be subject to a legislative vote
- 7) Are there any specific taxes you would advocate increasing or reducing?
- 8) Are there any specific government programs (federal, state and or local) you would cut or eliminate?
- 9) Would you vote against or oppose federal, state and local budgets that fail to address high and rising levels of expenditure?

10) A number of Republicans have demonstrated their lack of respect for taxpayers by voting for or advocating tax increases (including but not limited to overrides, debt exclusions, sponsoring legislation to enable municipalities to impose new taxes, new excise taxes and new payroll taxes). What will you do to stop this troubling trend?

11) A number of Republicans have demonstrated their lack of prudent fiscal stewardship by advocating for new welfare state programs or fecklessly voting for budgets that recklessly increase spending and public indebtedness. What will you do to stop this troubling trend?

Gun Rights

- 1) Do you support or oppose our inalienable, natural Right to Keep and Bear Arms?

- 2) Do you believe that government should be imposing any restrictions on our Right to Keep and Bear Arms?

- 3) How would you have voted on the 2017 Massachusetts Bump Stock Ban?

- 4) Are you familiar with the 2018 ERPO "Red Flag Law", which allow a court to issue an ex-parte (in other words, before any notice at all to the subject of the order) so-called "Extreme Risk Protection Order (ERPO)" which involves a court entering a secret order banning someone from possessing firearms or ammunition, and confiscating the firearms and ammunition that an individual already owns? How would you have voted on this bill?
- 5) Are you familiar with the 2014 DeLeo-Peterson gun control bill, which expanding the state's 'may-issue' concealed carry policy to cover not only the carry of handguns, but also the ownership of handguns, rifles and shotguns? This increases the power of local police chiefs to arbitrarily deny the issuance of a Firearms Identification Card in their local jurisdictions. How would you have voted on this bill?
- 6) Would you support or oppose efforts to nullify or overturn the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts's unconstitutional efforts to prohibit the lawful purchase or transfer of many safe and high-quality pistols, revolvers and even certain semi-automatic firearms that are in common use in other parts of these united states?

- 7) Will you support a "Constitutional Carry" bill that would allow any law-abiding citizen to carry a firearm concealed without a permit and without having to pay a fee to exercise their right to keep and bear arms?
- 8) Are you willing to include on your campaign platform (including but not limited to your website, social media pages, campaign push cards etc.) where you stand on gun rights issues?
- 9) Would you be able to resist the peer pressure to vote for a pro-gun grabbing politician in your party's primary, caucus or other contested party election if he were running against a pro-gun rights candidate?

Limited Government

- 1) What is the proper role of the federal government, the state government and local government?
- 2) Do you support socialized healthcare programs, including but not limited to RomneyCare, ObamaCare and "Medicare for all, aka Single-Payer Healthcare"?
- 3) Do you support government control (whether through federal, state or local governing bodies) over education or do you support returning control of education to parents and children?
- 4) Do you support or oppose former President Trump's proposal for "paid-family medical leave", a new taxpayer-funded welfare state benefit?

5) Do you support or oppose the "Renewable Portfolio Standards", which force utilities to buy expensive, unreliable "green energy" in the name of "saving the environment"?

6) Do you support or oppose banning plastic grocery bags?

7) Do you support or oppose the bottle deposit law? Would you support expanding the bottle deposit law to include noncarbonated beverages such as water, juice and wine?

8) Will you oppose all efforts to apply to the U.S. Congress for an Article V Convention and support legislation to rescind any existing applications?

9) Will you oppose any bill that impedes free speech, including any so-called "campaign finance" or "campaign practice" bill that would require a citizen organization to divulge its donor or member information?

10) Will you support legislation to end the use of “no knock” warrants for non-violent crimes?

11) Will you support legislation that would end “policing for profit,” including equitable sharing with federal authorities, require charges be filed before any assets are seized by law enforcement, and ensure that property is returned if charges are dropped or the suspect is acquitted?

12) Do you support ending U.S. involvement in multi-lateral globalist institutions such as the UN?

13) Should U.S. law ever be subordinated to foreign law or no?

- 14) Are you willing to include on your campaign platform (including but not limited to your website, social media pages, campaign push cards etc.) where you stand on the size, scope and cost of government?
- 15) Would you be able to resist the peer pressure to vote for a pro-big government politician in your party's primary, caucus or other contested party election, if they were running against a pro-limited government candidate?
- 16) Do you believe that politicians and political operatives should be able to use the 209A and 258E laws (that allow people (most commonly wives in a domestic dispute with their husbands) to claim endangerment without evidence) to be able to obtain restraining orders on their political critics? An example of this took place in 2016 in the *Van Liew vs. Stansfield* case heard by the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court.
- 17) Did you support or oppose the extended lockdowns of society instituted by Charlie Baker in response to the Chinese Communist coronavirus "pandemic".
